The Crisis Fund is to benefit people in crisis who are urgently in need of small, one off amounts of money. These funds can be accessed through charitable organisations throughout Cornwall who hold a pot of funds to distribute to individuals in crisis situations. Charitable organisations reaching people in Crisis can apply for £250 to distribute small amounts, usually £30 or less to a maximum of £90 when there is a need for immediate help, to alleviate destitution or poverty.
